


MICHIGAN WOLF FACTS

- Federal recovery goal: **100 wolves** between *both* Michigan and Wisconsin
- State recovery goal: 200 wolves
- Current wolf population minimum of 762 wolves in the Upper Peninsula
- Michigan has met federal recovery goals since **1994**
- Wolves are present in **every county** in the Upper Peninsula
- **90% of residents** surveyed indicated wolves pose some risk to pets, livestock
- Scientists agree: Great Lakes wolves are no longer endangered <u>Read More</u>

- Wolves have **killed 81 dog**s in Michigan



MINNESOTA WOLF FACTS

- Federal recovery goal: 1,251-1,400 wolves
- State recovery goal: **1,600 wolves**
- Current wolf population: 2,700 wolves
- Michigan has met federal recovery goals since **1989**
- Many tribes agree with lethal removal of wolves for **predator/prey balance**
- Scientists agree: Great Lakes wolves are no longer endangered **<u>Read More</u>**

- 30 counties in Minnesota experienced wolf depredations costing \$621,022




WISCONSIN WOLF FACTS

- Federal recovery goal **100 wolves** between *both* Michigan and Wisconsin
- State recovery goal 100 wolves
- Current wolf population 972 wolves
- Wisconsin has met federal recovery goals since **1994**
- Wisconsin's wolf plan recognizes the biologically **recovered status** of wolves
- 29 dogs and 651 livestock threatened or killed in 2024
- Scientists agree: Great Lakes wolves are no longer endangered **<u>Read More</u>**




MONTANA WOLF FACTS

- Current population: 1,081-1,260 wolves
- Montana has met federal recovery goals since 2002
- Montana's Livestock Compensation Fund
 Dwindles as Depredation Increases



WYOMING WOLF FACTS

- Federal recovery goal: 15 breeding pairs,
 150 wolves
- State recovery goal: 100 wolves outside Yellowstone and Wind River Reservation
- Current population: **352 wolves** outside Yellowstone and Wind River Reservation
- Wyoming has met federal recovery goals since **2001**
- Wyoming Game and Fish coordinates with federal and tribal agencies to ensure federal recovery goals are met
- Wolf populations remain steady through the use of regulated hunting and trapping

IDAHO WOLF FACTS

- Federal recovery goal: 15 breeding pairs,
 150 wolves
- State recovery goal: 500 wolves
- Current wolf population: 1,150 wolves
- Idaho has met federal recovery goals since 2002
- **299** livestock producers have suffered over **<u>1,290 depredations</u>** since 2014
- Wolf populations continue to **increase** even with hunting and trapping
